Get to know our animals

Alpacas

- Alpaca fur is very soft and can be used to make clothing. What other animals have soft fur?
- Alpacas are part of the camelid family, so they're related to camels.
- Alpacas are smaller and more shy than llamas.

Chickens

- Chickens are one of the closest living relatives of dinosaurs.
- Chickens can dream. What do you think they dream about?
- We have 5-10 breeds of chickens. How many can you spot?

Sheep

- Male sheep are called rams, females are called ewes, and babies are called lambs. How many lambs do we have?
- Our sheep are a breed called St. Croix. They're "hair sheep" which means that they shed their hair and don't need to be sheared.

Goats

- Both male and female goats can have horns.
- Goats have rectangular pupils. What shape are human's?
- Goats use their lips to help grab food.

Cows

- Cows are very social, they can have best friends!
- Cows have four stomach compartments to help them digest their food.
- Our cows are male, so they don't produce milk.

Get to know Plumper Pumpkins!

We grow three types of Christmas trees!

Douglas firs, noble firs, and grand firs. We can tell them apart by looking at their needles

There's a secret tunnel under our farm!

About 180ft below our barnyard silo, there's an old train tunnel that was built in 1911-12.

A tornado once visited our farm!

In September 2019, an EF-0 tornado touched down near our Pumpkin House. It damaged a chunk of our corn maze and solar panels.

We grow more than 40 kinds of pumpkins!

Last year, our biggest giant pumpkin weighed 459 pounds- that's as heavy as an adult gorilla!

What happens to the apples and pumpkins we shoot from the cannons?

A neighborhood herd of 50-100 elk come through the farm early in the morning and eat up any produce that isn't protected.
